HISTORY OF THE MANY USS VIRGINIA'S

<u>USS Virginia</u> (1776), was a 28-gun <u>sailing frigate</u> built in 1776, captured by the British in the following year and recommissioned as HMS Virginia

USS Virginia (1797), was a 14-gun revenue cutter built in 1797 and returned to the Revenue Cutter

USS Virginia (1825), was a 74-gun ship of the line laid down in 1818 but never launched, and broken up

USS Virginia (1861), was a captured Spanish blockade runner during the American Civil War and commissioned into the United States' Navy

<u>USS Virginia (BB-13)</u>, was a Virginia-class <u>battleship</u> commissioned in 1906, decommissioned in 1920, and destroyed in 1923 as a bombing target


<u>USS Virginia</u> (SP-274), was a yacht purchased by the Navy and officially referred to only as SP-274, patrolled Lake Michigan during World War I

<u>USS Virginia</u> (SP-746), was a motorboat acquired by the Navy and officially referred to only as SP-746, patrolled the east coast during World War I
