Here and There



This month's featured cover is not really a cover but a Ceremony Program produced by the Postal Service to celebrate the release of a new stamp or set of stamps. The Ceremony Program doubles as a First-Day-of-Issue

of the Stamps. The illustration on the front cover of the US Navy Submarines Ceremony Program shows a scene of the submarine base superimposed with a scene of General Dynamics Electric Boat Division from the New London side of the Thames River. This particular Ceremony Program is a tri-fold with the history of the submarine outlined on the right. The center panel has a list of the attending dignitaries with their official titles and their role in the program. The list included Postal Service employees from DC Headquarters as well as politicians and US Navy representatives. Of note, both CT US Senators at the time attended but only Senator Christopher Dodd stayed for the program-signing event. In addition, I also got Capt. Lincoln's signature. He was the Commander of the



shows the five stamps released at the ceremony, cancelled with the First Day of Issue postmark, Mar 27 2000, Groton CT. The stamps depict the USS Holland, the first US Navy operational submarine, a WWI S-Class submarine, a WWII Gato Class submarine, the USS Los Angles Class and an Ohio Class SSBN. The stamps are denominated and paid the following rates: USS Los Angeles, 33 ¢ - first class rate, S − Class boat, 22 ¢ - Post Card rate Ohio Class, 55 ¢ - Double first class rate USS Holland, 60 ¢ - International rate Gato Class, \$3.20 – Priority Mail rate Additional information included on the program are the stamp illustrator, Jim Griffiths of Glenview, IL and the Art Director, Carl Herrman of Carlsbad, CA. Neither attended the ceremony. Ceremony Programs are not listed in the Scott Specialized Catalogue of US Stamps, probably because they are not available to the general collecting public. To obtain one you must be present at the ceremony. The USPS distributes them to attendees for free. However, they are available on the secondary market and there are dealers who

specialize in ceremony programs. Most sell in the 1-2 range depending on the value of the stamps. The submarine stamps were issued in a prestige booklet Scott # 3377a, 5 stamps in a pane # 3373 – 3377. The Los Angles Class submarine was also released as a sheet stamp Scott # 3372 with USPS micro-printing. The booklet stamp # 3374 has no micro-printing.
