I acquired the featured post card in a lot I purchased in New Haven last month. It was a collection of early $20^{\text {th }}$ century post cards depicting life in the deep south of former slaves and their descendants. The featured post card illustrates a man and a boy driving a Buck Board. The Buck Board carriage was a type of wagon designed to move goods rather than people.

Note that the wagon is being pulled by a bull rather than a horse. The message states, "Rapid transit in the South by starting 6 weeks ahead." Mailed from Pensacola, FL to New York City, 21 Dec 1913. However the philatelic importance of this particular card is the WashingtonFranklin coil used to pay the $1 \notin$ postage rate for post cards in 1913. Washington Franklin coils are scarce on post cards due to many being removed by dealers and collectors for used examples. This coil is the Scott \# 392, perf 81/2 vertical coil of 1910, worth $\$ 75$ on
