Obie and Renata manning the Club Table

Post Card mailed at Balboa, CZ, on 2 Feb 1921 and franked with Vasco Nunez de Balboa, 1¢ green stamp of 1918 Sc # 52 with Canal Zone overprint type IV reading up. The distinguishing characteristic of the Ty IV overprint is the E of zone, the middle bar is the same length as the upper and lower bar. The message is essentially a greetings from Balboa, Panama, to a recipient in NYC and complains about the heat in the tropics. Panama lies about 8° north of the equator. Balboa is a suburb of Panama City on the Pacific side of the canal and was the administrative center for canal operations. The picture side shows the battle ship USS Rode Island BB 17 in Gatun Lake on the Atlantic side of the canal. The result of a geographic oddity, you travel east to traverse the canal from the Caribbean to the Pacific Ocean. According to Navy records, the RI traversed the canal on 1 Aug, 1919 to join the Pacific Fleet as flagship of Battleship Squadron 1. The RI was laid down in 1902 at the Fore River Shipbuilding Company, Quincy, MA. She was commissioned in 1906 and participated with 15 other battleships in the Great White Fleet Round-the-World, showing the flag trip from December 1907 to February 1909. RI was decommissioned in Jun 1920 having served during WWI.
