CT Tercentenary

In 1935 CT celebrated its Tercentenary with a 3¢ stamp commemorating the charter oak Scott # 772 issued on April 26, 1935 in Hartford CT. April 26, 1935 was the official first day while April 27, 1935 was the first day (second day) for national distribution in Washington, DC. FDCs posted on April 26 in Hartford are worth much more than second day covers posted at Washington, DC as noted in the Scott 2022 US Specialized Catalogue. Many cachets exist and the one illustrated is attributed to F. Van Wilson who created a set of six covers depicting scenes of life in early Connecticut. The particular cachet illustrated shows Adriaen Block a 16th century Dutch explorer, credited with exploring the Connecticut River above Hartford. According to the Connecticut Tercentenary Issue of 1935 by LaPlaca and Dewey, the set of six covers is considered the "best of issue in the Planty catalogue." It is designated 772-42f in the Planty/Mellone numbering system. Note the designs were created for the Travelers Insurance Co. as set of illustrated wall calendars in 1935. The other designs depict Hartford goes to Church 772-42a, The Fundamental Orders are Created 772-42b, GOV Andros arrives at Sanford Tavern 772-42c, The Witch is Persecuted 772-42d, and 1635 Colonial Hartford 1935 772-42e. I found individual samples from the set of six ranging in price from \$13 to \$25 on e-Bay.
