This cover was mailed from Fort Richardson (Anchorage) AK, 29 Dec 1941 to Hughson CA. The sender was Sgt. W. E. Alderson to Mr. & Mrs. L. E. Alderson, probably his parents. Hughson is a farming community directly east of San Francisco. The US had just entered the war and there are no sensor markings on the cover. The cachet on this cover is attributable to Walter G Crosby who was a prolific Naval and Air-Mail cachet maker. His distinctive raised color ink design is easily recognized; plus there is the added bonus of a photo worked into the design of the ship or aircraft honored. This particular cachet is commemorating the PAA flying boat that opened the Pacific air routes to Asia and the Pacific Islands. Many of the PAA destinations are noted in this particular cachet. In the 1940's the only way to get to Alaska by commercial airline was via the PAA flying boat. The photo shows the Sikorsky flying boat along with a dog sled (a more traditional way of getting around AK in those days). I suspect that the Crosby cached envelopes were available in the PX and were purchased to be used as souvenir envelopes for correspondence home, as this item clearly illustrates. I show some additional examples of Crosby Cached envelopes used for correspondence from the same time period, all with Alaska postmarks. Note that by 1942 censor tapes were added as the two top covers show. The one shown on lower right is identical to my illustrated cover.
